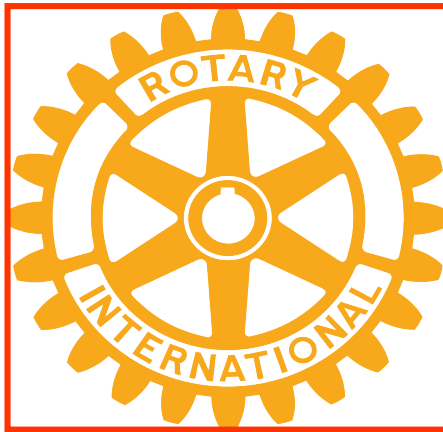

Editorial Re: The Annual Berry Show.

This event is one of the major annual commitments of our club along with the NYE Fireworks, The Celtic Festival , The Small Farms Field Days and to a lesser extent the Chocolate Wheel operation.

There are some interesting general statistics that have emerged from this year's BBQ & Grill operation compared to previous years. The one most prominent is that about 50% of the workers for each of the four sessions were not club members. Using the Roster for Berry Show BBQ event 2019 as a guide, approximately 40% of club members participated over the four sessions, with many doubling up each day. In addition to those who worked during the show several members did sterling work with the preliminary setup.

It needs to be said that some members do have alternative and prior commitments, some are simply unable physically to assist but it's difficult to believe this is applicable to 60% of the club.

The BBQ & Grill isn't the most enjoyable venue in which to work, the work can be demanding and uncomfortable but for three hours in a day is it too much to ask?

We are a Service Club, this involves work and if we're not prepared to put ourselves out a bit for the major club fundraisers we could well ask ourselves the reason we pay \$260.00 P/A in membership fees.
