SAIL

Setting sail before the end of January 2024 in his 50' sloop Marnie, Ken will leave Port Hacking, Sydney for a solo circum-navigation of Tasmania.



On the way, making a stopover in the Southwest Wilderness Area of Tasmania - at Bathurst Harbour, in order to climb the summit of Mount Rugby (773 metres above sea level), being situated on the shores of the harbour.



From the summit of Mount Rugby, launch a paraglider and soar back to the anchored yacht.

Then, continue navigating the west coast of Tasmania passing King Island before sailing back across the Strait towards home.

TREK:

Once home, Ken will prepare for one of the world's great treks, the Kokoda Trail, leading a group of Rotarians and friends in April 2024, who together, will be raising funds & awareness for ShelterBox.
